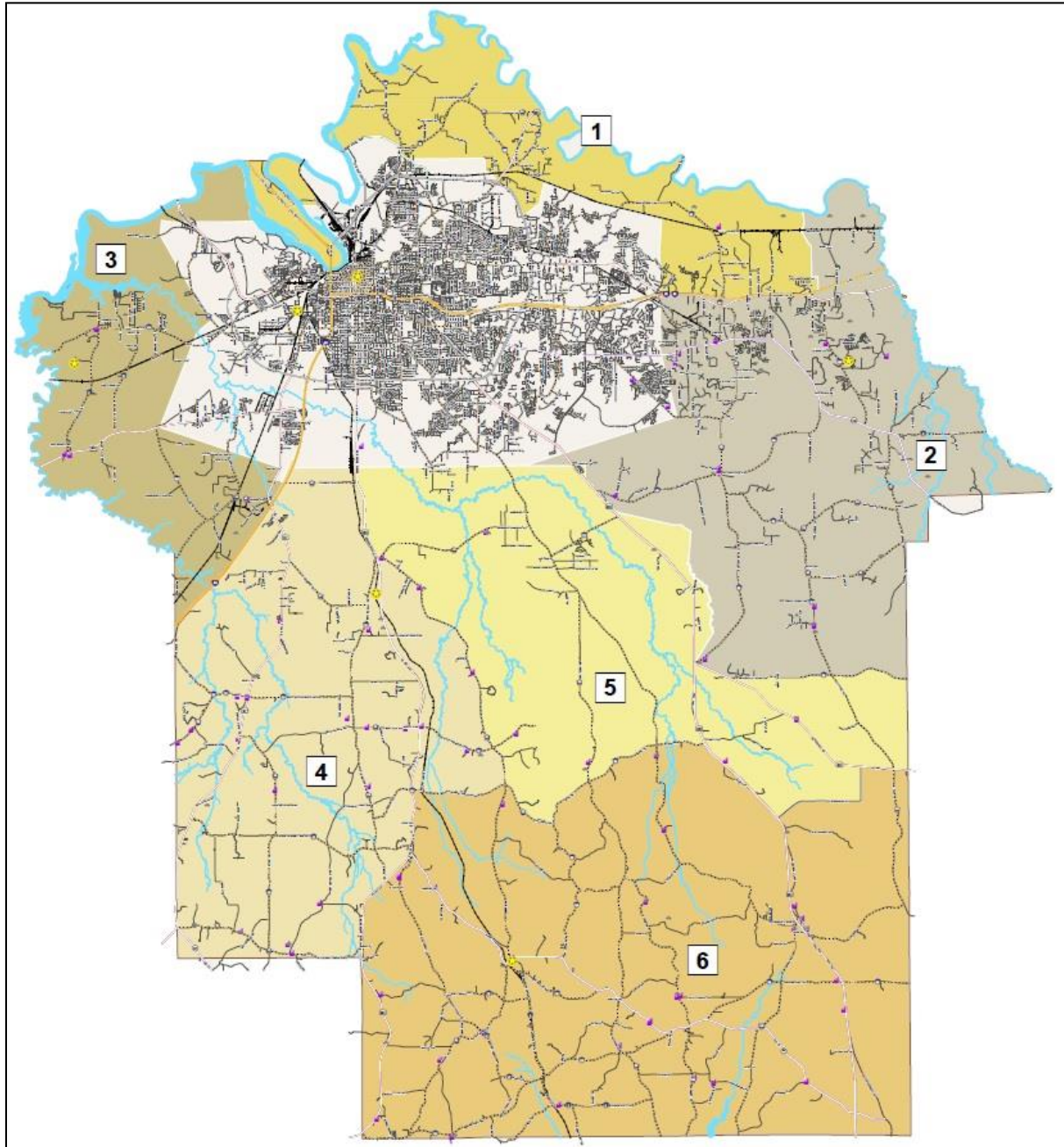

District 2 Arrests

A series of burglaries of a District 2 business were cleared by arrest due to deputies and the business owner working together. The business provided Sgt. R. Whitmore with video evidence of the offenders and suspect vehicle. Investigators located the suspect vehicle and arrested one suspect who later confessed.

Simultaneously the business owner was checking his business and discovered other suspects on his property, notified MCSO dispatch and responding deputies arrested Kevin Lee Sides.

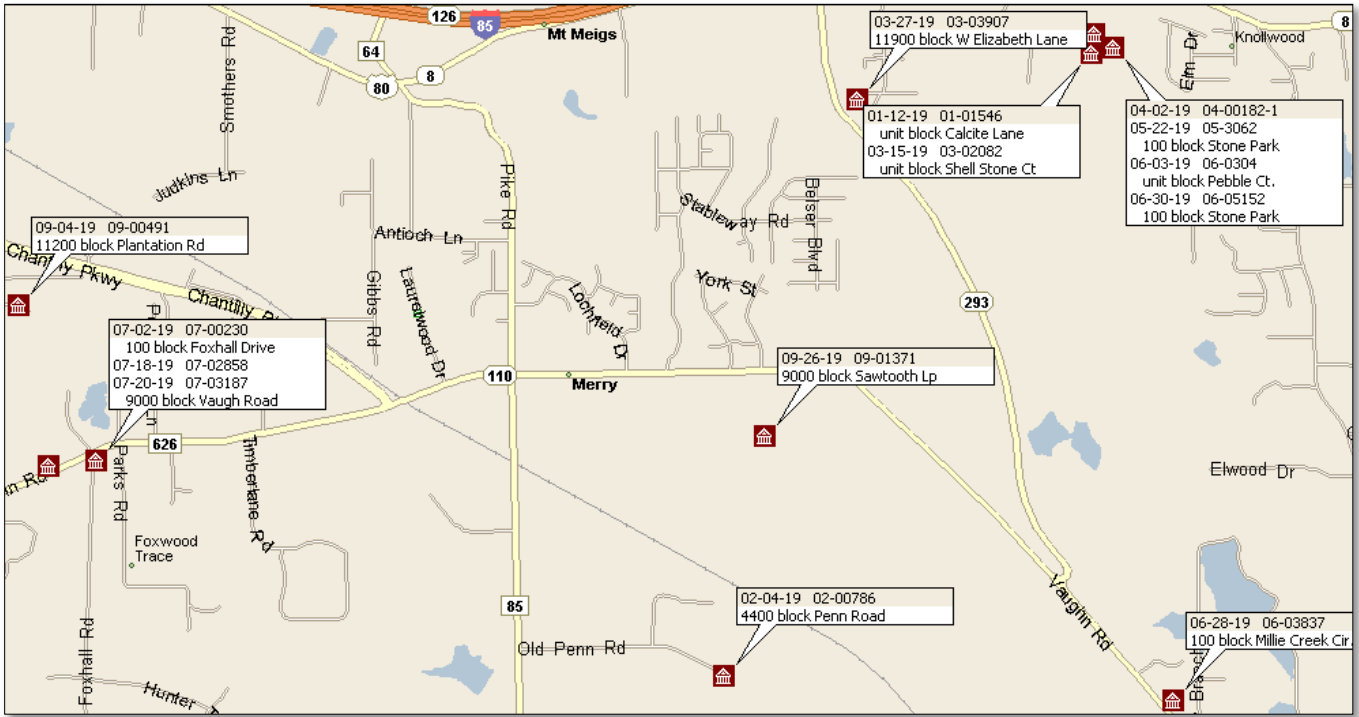

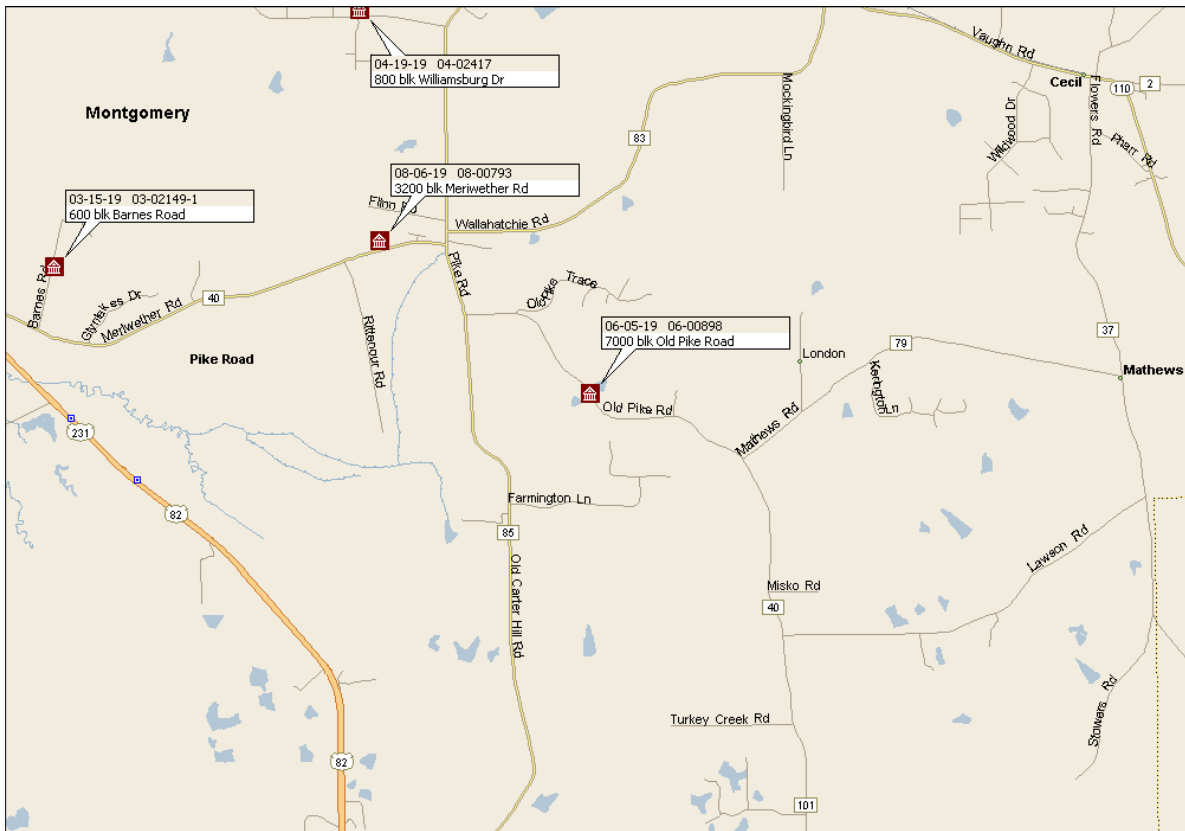

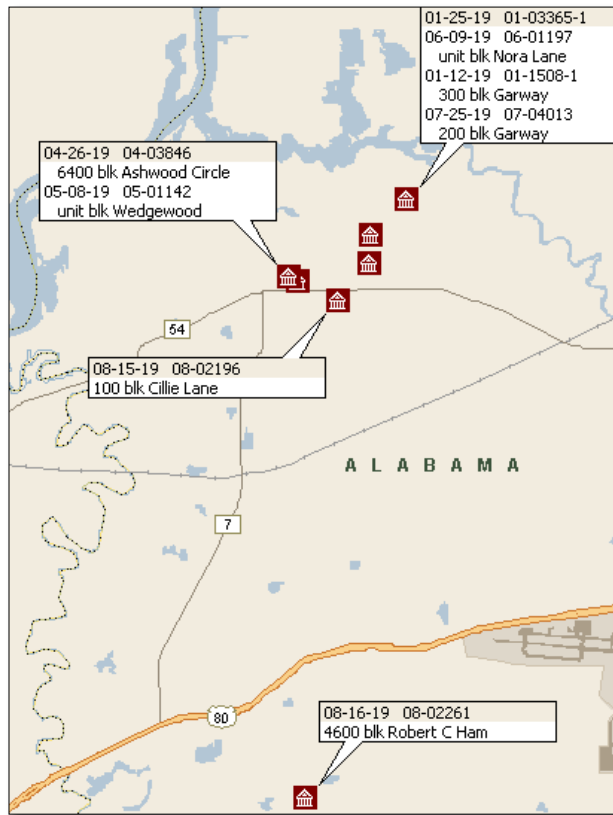

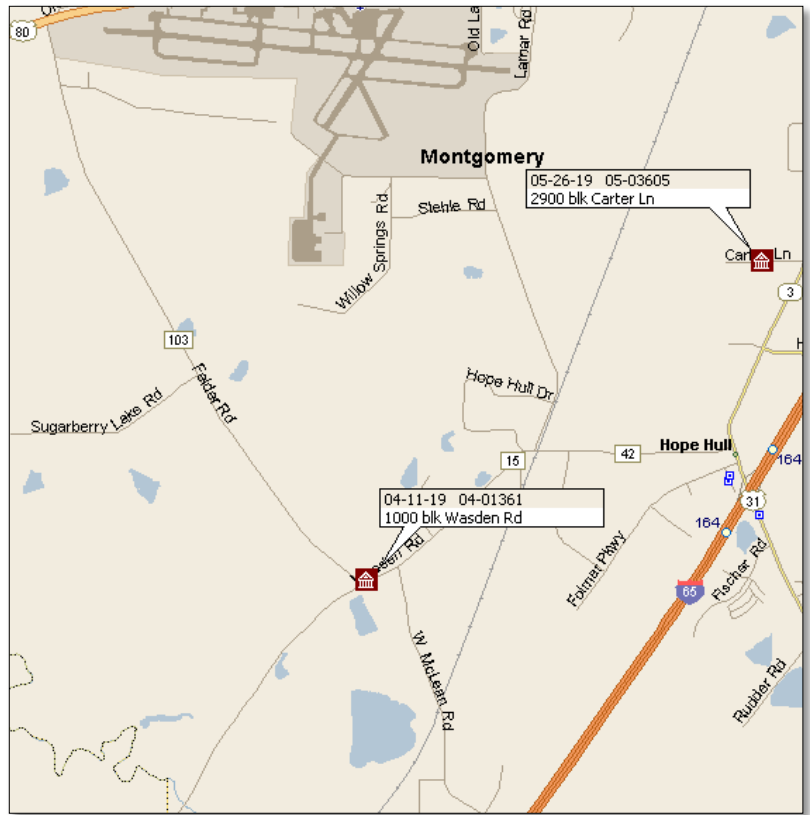

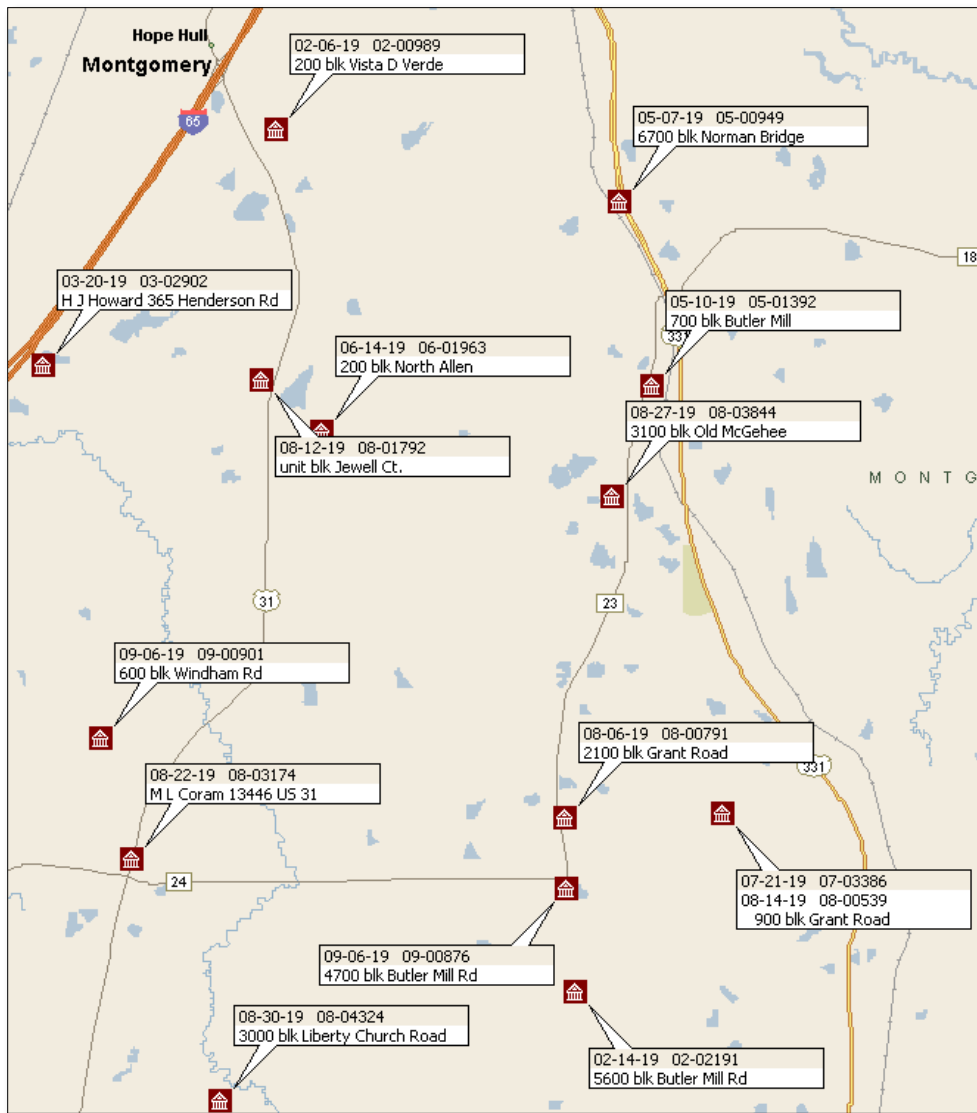

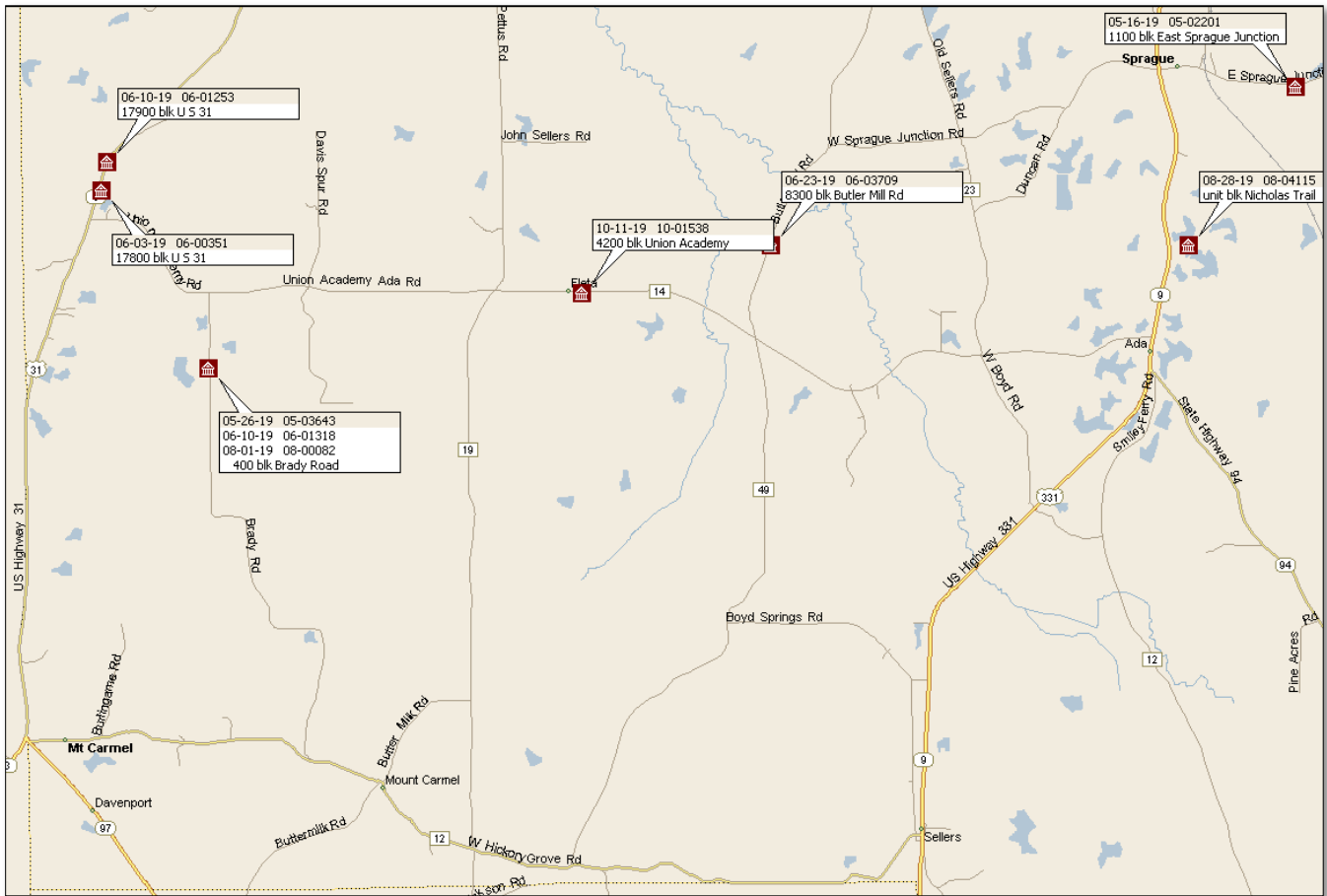

2019 Residential Burglaries in the Southern part of District 4



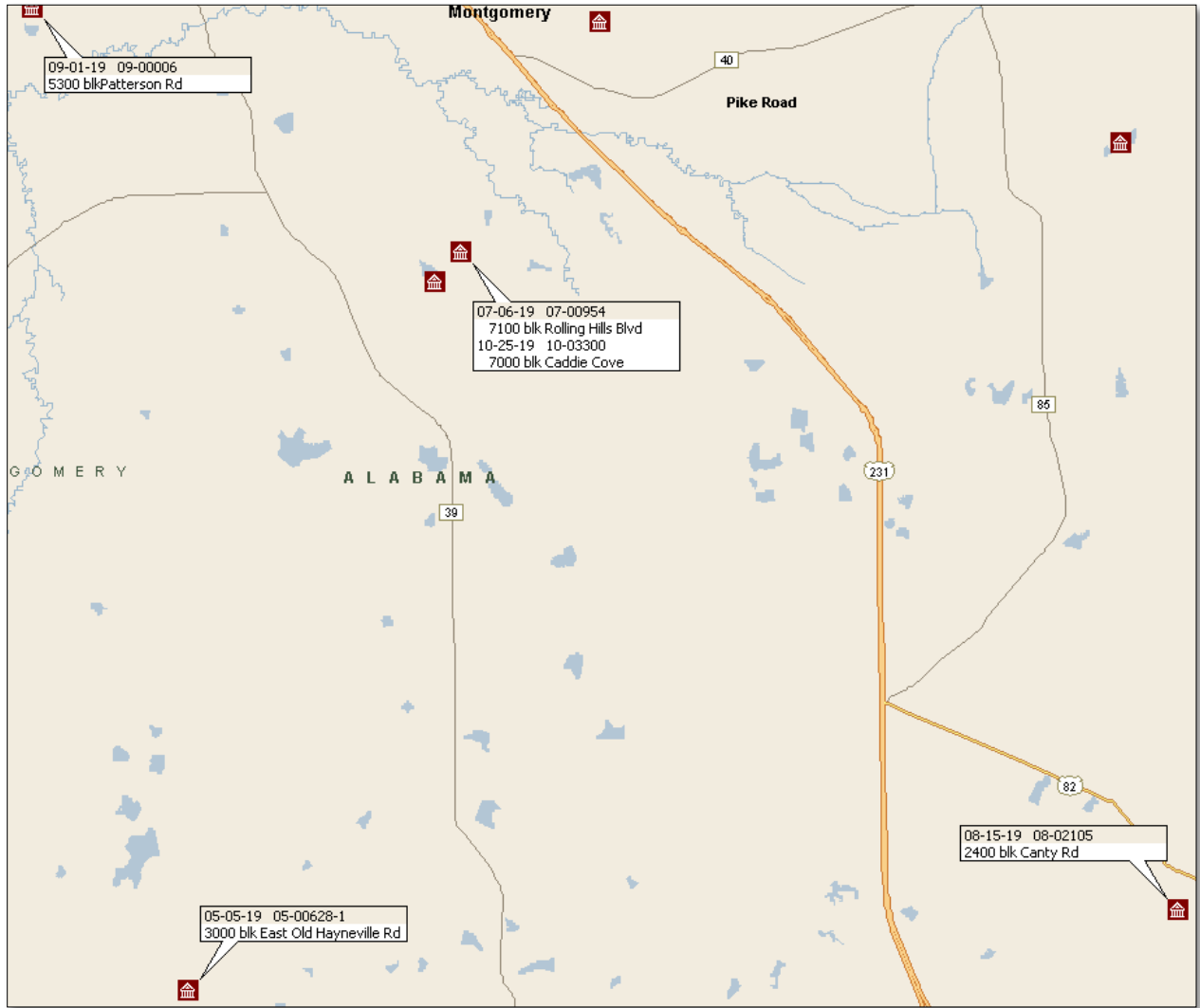

Red squares indicate locations of residential burglaries

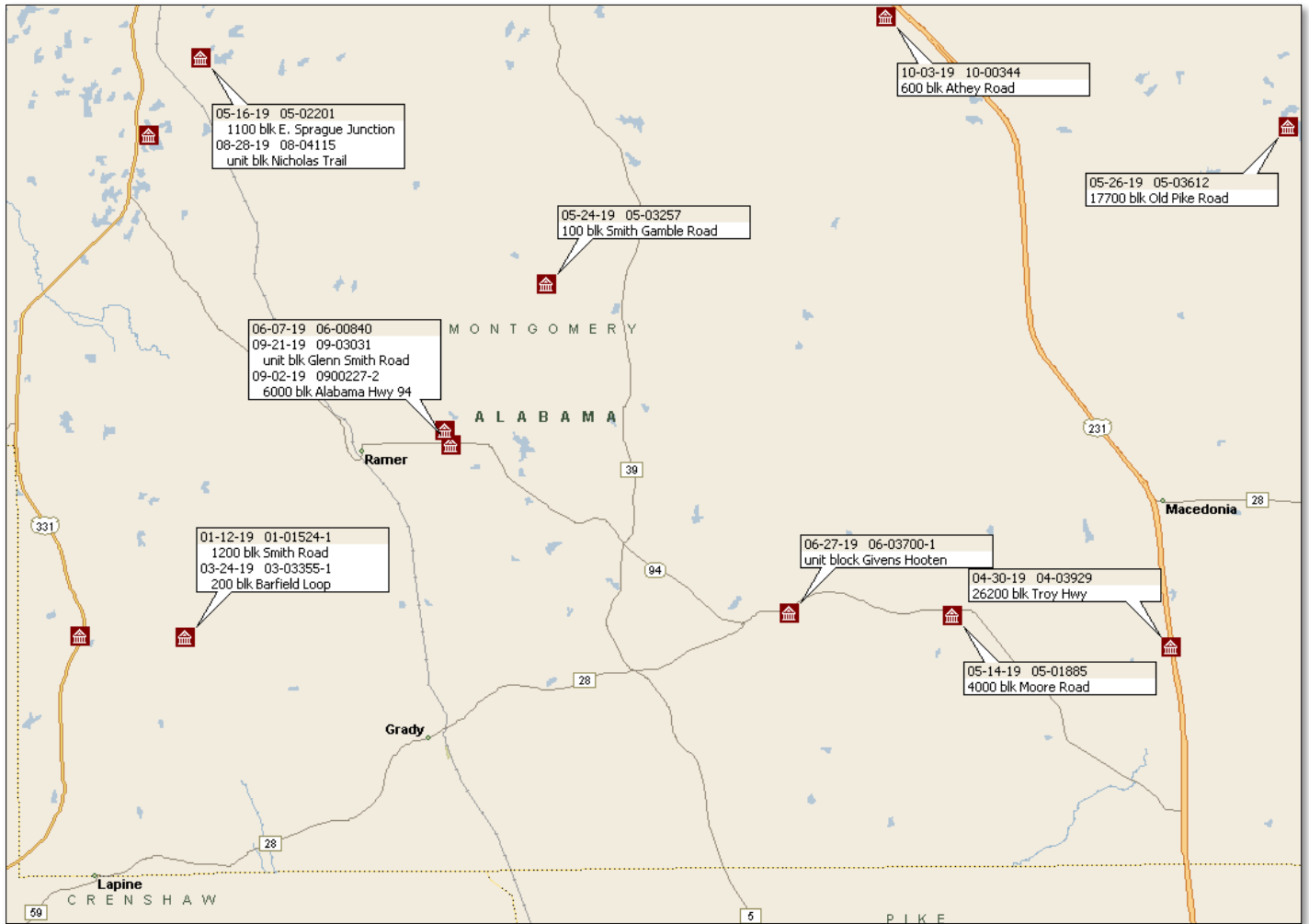

2019 Second Quarter Deputy of the Quarter



A District 2 business was burglarized, and property valued at several thousand dollars was stolen by multiple offenders. Video surveillance provided by the business' owner was distributed to M.C.S.O. deputies. Lt. J. Douglass recognized one of the offenders and provided investigators with information making it possible to ultimately identify and arrest four suspects. Further investigation resulted in solving other burglaries in the City of Montgomery and City of Millbrook. Lt. Douglass' diligence and attention to duty as a patrol supervisor demonstrates how patrol deputies provide investigators with crucial leads that break cases that may often go unsolved. Such exemplary work merits his recognition as being named second quarter "Deputy of the Quarter." Congratulations Lieutenant Douglass.

2019 Third Quarter Deputy of the Quarter



In early July the Sheriff's Office received information of a subject wanted for outstanding felony warrants who was reportedly traveling in a silver or gray 2-door Honda on I-85 in Montgomery County. Sgt. D. Talley responded to the area and spotted a vehicle matching the vehicle's description. The vehicle exited I-85 when the driver activated emergency flashers and exited the vehicle. At that time Sgt. Talley was able to identify him as the wanted subject, activated his blue lights and took him into custody. During a search of the suspect (incident to arrest) a stolen pistol was found on his person. A search of his vehicle was conducted where a kilo of crystal methamphetamine was discovered.

Sgt. J. Woodfin's commendation of Talley states: "Cpl. Talley's attention to detail, when faced with a vague vehicle description, allowed him to locate the suspect's vehicle, recover a stolen firearm, and prevent a large amount of drugs from reaching the streets of Montgomery County." Sgt. Talley is recognized as Deputy of the Quarter for the third quarter of 2019. Congratulations and well-done Sergeant Talley.

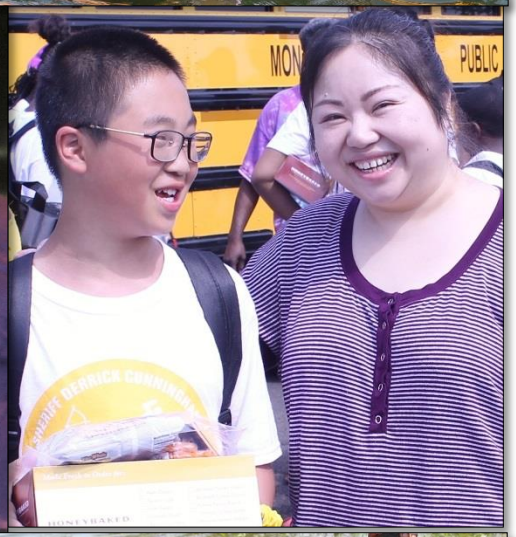

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office is now accepting applications for our *Citizens Academy*. The Citizens Academy was established in 1997 to educate the citizens of Montgomery County on how the Sheriff's Office operates and to promote public safety among our community members. Classes are designed to be interesting as well as informative. Citizens are given an opportunity to ride with a deputy on patrol, tour the County Jail, volunteer at events that are sponsored by the Sheriff's Office as well as train on the Firearms Training Simulator. The course is a free 6-week course that meets on Monday evenings from 6:00-7:00 p.m. at our office, located at 115 South Perry Street and is taught by Sheriff's Office deputies and Correctional Officers. All materials will be discussed during the meetings and neither homework nor physical activity is required.

Montgomery County Sheriff's Office TO INCREASE ACCESS TO SAFE MEDICATION DISPOSAL WITH DRUG COLLECTION UNIT DONATED BY CVS HEALTH

Joint effort by CVS Health and Partnership for Drug-Free Kids aims to combat drug abuse, encourage safe drug disposal in local communities

On Friday, March 17, 2017, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office unveiled their new drug collection unit they received as part of CVS Health's Medication Disposal for Safer Communities Grant Program. The new unit will be located at Administrative Office of the Sheriff, at 100 South Lawrence (2nd floor lobby) and will provide residents with a safe and environmentally responsible way to dispose of unwanted, unused or expired medication, including controlled substances.

"CVS Health is dedicated to helping the communities we serve address and prevent prescription drug abuse," said Tom Davis, R.Ph. Vice President of Pharmacy Professional Services at CVS Health. "Reducing the amount of unused and unwanted medication in the home is critical to preventing prescription drug abuse. We are proud to work with the Partnership for Drug-Free Kids and local leaders to increase convenient access to safe medication disposal."

The new drug disposal unit will help to reduce the amount of unneeded medicine in residents' homes and decrease the potential for prescription drug abuse, which has soared in recent years, especially among teenagers. More than 70 percent of teenagers say it is easy to get prescription drugs from their parents' medicine cabinets, according to a Partnership for Drug-Free Kids study. Proper drug disposal also helps to prevent the contamination of local landfills and water supplies from unused medication.

Over the last few years, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has participated with the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) and their Drug Take Program. We have collected hundreds of pounds of unused or expired medication. "Sheriff Derrick Cunningham and the staff of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office are proud to partner with CVS and would like to thank them for providing this grant opportunity. This Drug Collection Unit will help us offer the citizens of Montgomery a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating them about the potential for abuse and misuse of medication". The Medication Disposal for Safer Communities program has donated more than 600 drug collection units to law enforcement agencies across the country, which have collected more than 47 metric tons or 100,000 pounds, of unwanted medication. CVS Health also assists law enforcement by supporting local drug take back events and promoting local drug disposal collection sites.

MCSO Firearms Familiarization Course



We have already begun our firearms course to “familiarize” Montgomery County citizens about the laws and proper use of a firearm. We know that learning how to protect yourself is very important in today’s world. Our course is held one Saturday a month. The next class has been scheduled for the following date:

The class is held at our Sheriff D. T. Marshall Firearms Training Center located at 6900 Janet

Warner Road and is **FREE** to Montgomery County citizens! The morning session is classroom instruction on firearm safety and firearm laws. The afternoon session allows citizens to practice shooting on our Firing Range for the remainder of the class (if you would like). All classes are under the instruction of the Montgomery County Sheriff’s Office Range Master.

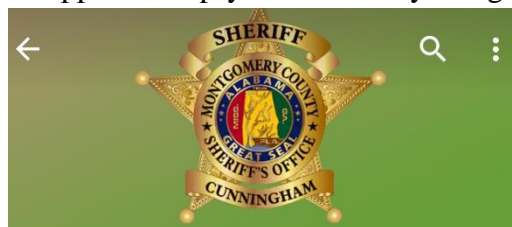

Sheriff's Office APP

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has a new phone app called "Montgomery County AL Sheriff" that can be accessed through your phone's app store. Once you have added this app to your phone, you can easily set your phone up to receive important push notifications. Push notifications are quick, important messages that can notify you of road closure(s), blocked road(s), anything pertinent to your travel, escapee, etc. While our app can help you with many things including checking to see if someone is in the county jail, it is most helpful to receive push notifications. After you have downloaded the app, go through the follow steps to make sure your phone is set up to receive the push notifications:



- Go to your phone's setting icon
 - Scroll down and click "Applications"
 - Scroll down to "MCSO" or "Montgomery County Sheriff"
- OR
- Click "Application Manager", if it doesn't take you directly to the location
 - Click "Notifications"
 - Turn 'on' "Allow Notifications" and "Previews in pop-ups"
