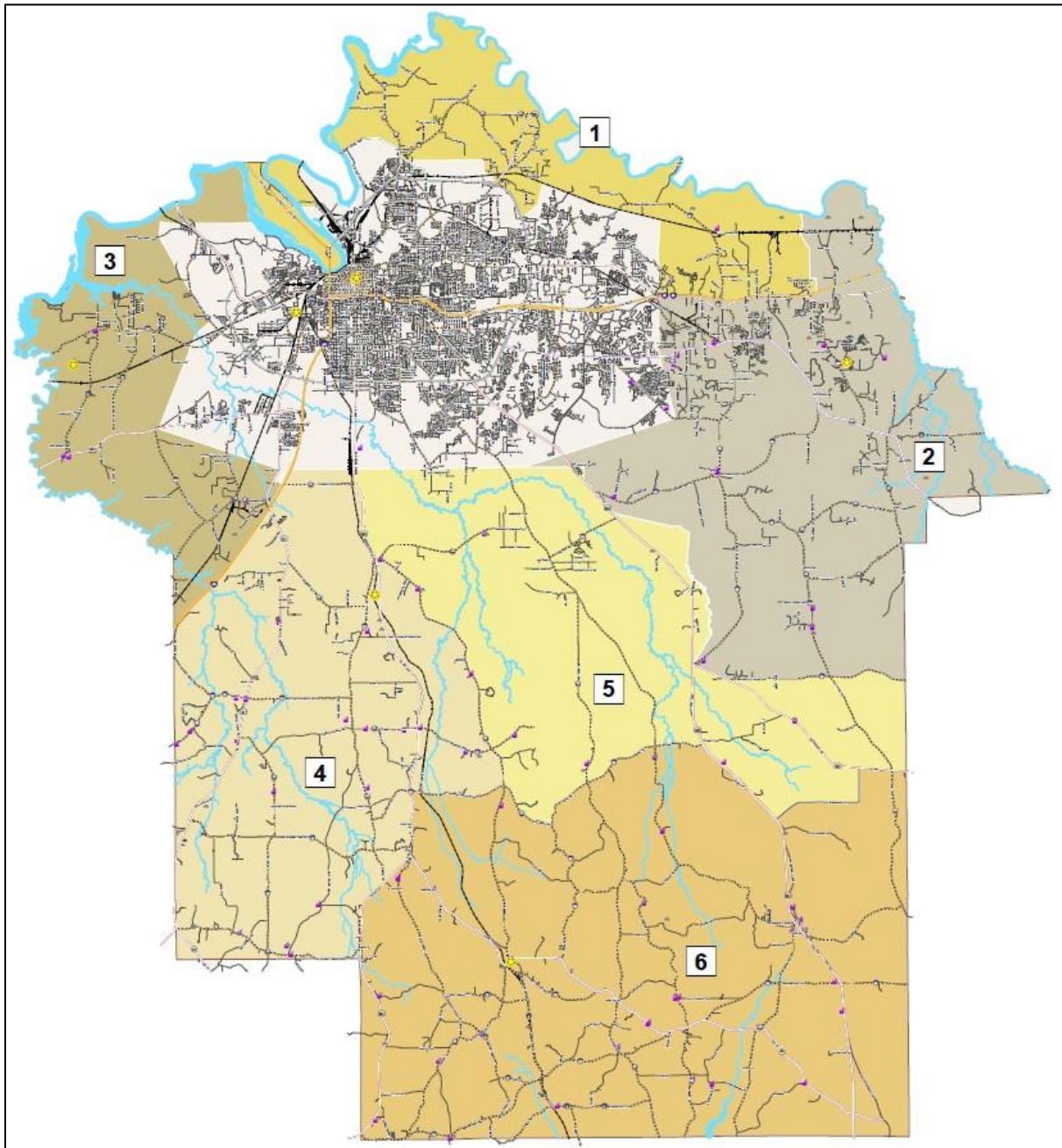

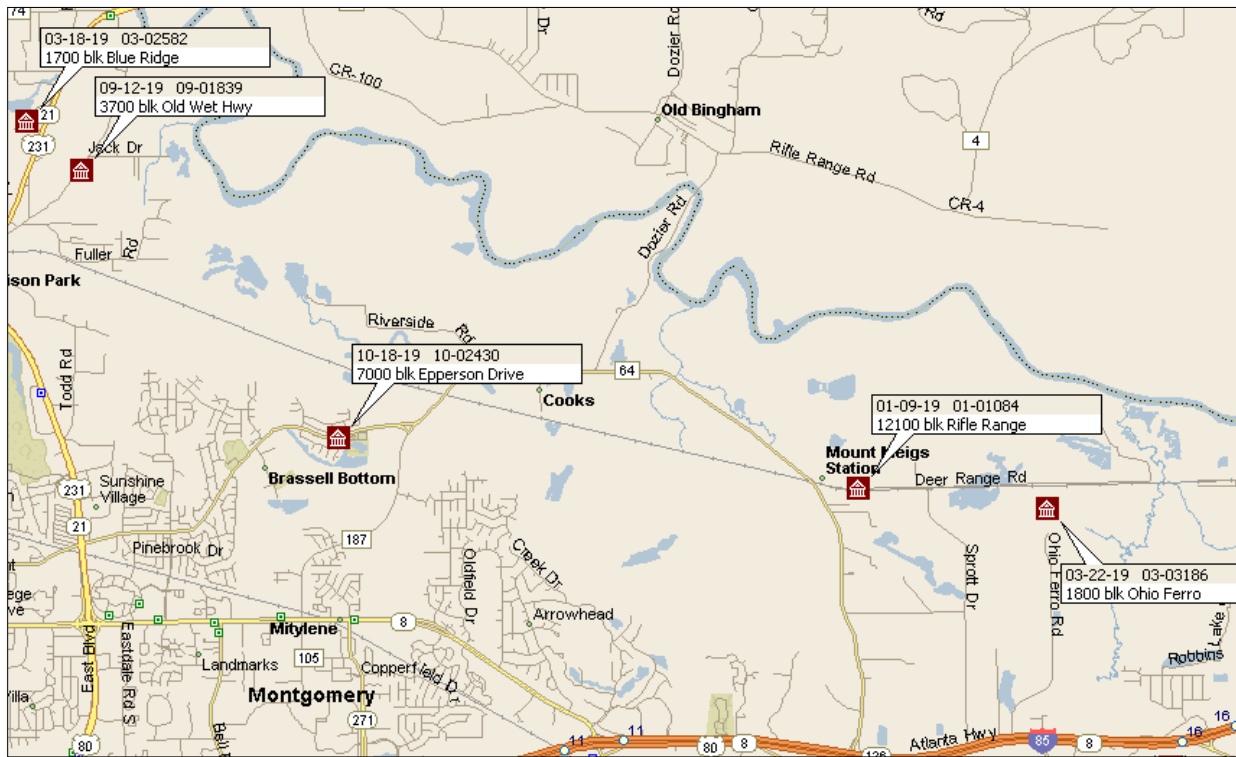

Charges: Reckless Endangerment.

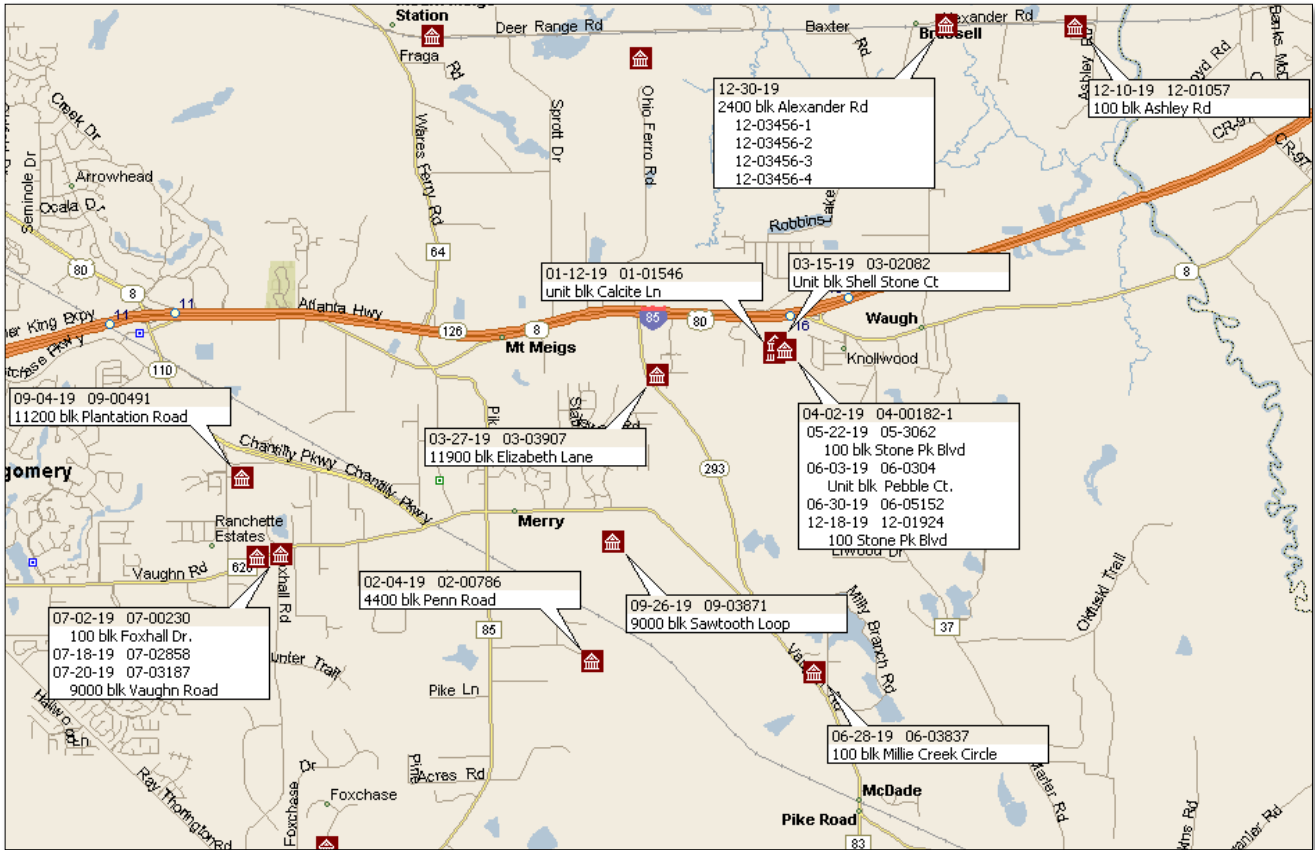

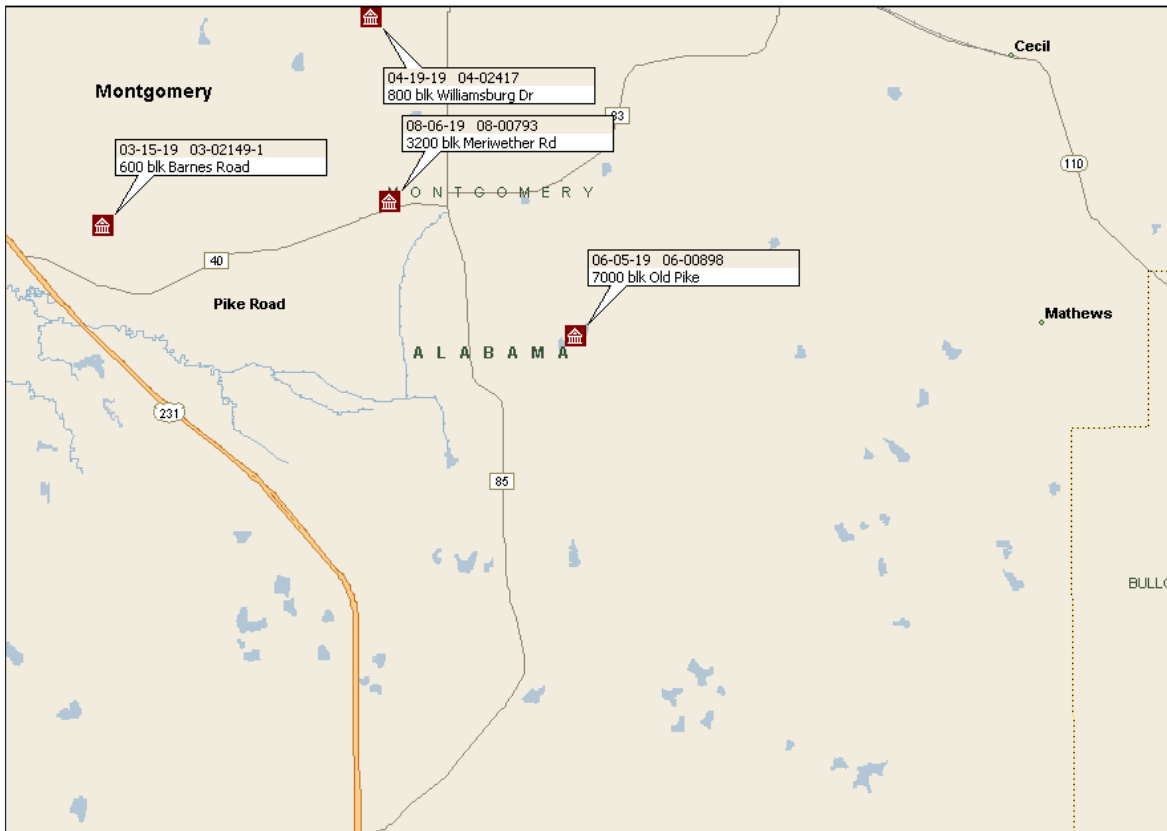

District 2 Arrests

The value and effectiveness of home alarm systems was demonstrated recently when a District 2 victim's home was burglarized. His security system has a phone app allowing him to visually monitor his home. When alerted to an alarm, he viewed the app and notified MCSO dispatchers of a burglary in progress. He remained on the phone with them and gave a description of the offender, who was [clearly] armed with a firearm. Responding deputies apprehended the suspect inside the dwelling and disarmed him without incident.

Charges: Burglary III, Theft II (gun), Certain persons forbidden to carry pistol.

Arrested: Kenvorise Canarion Clayton, age 18, of Pike Road.

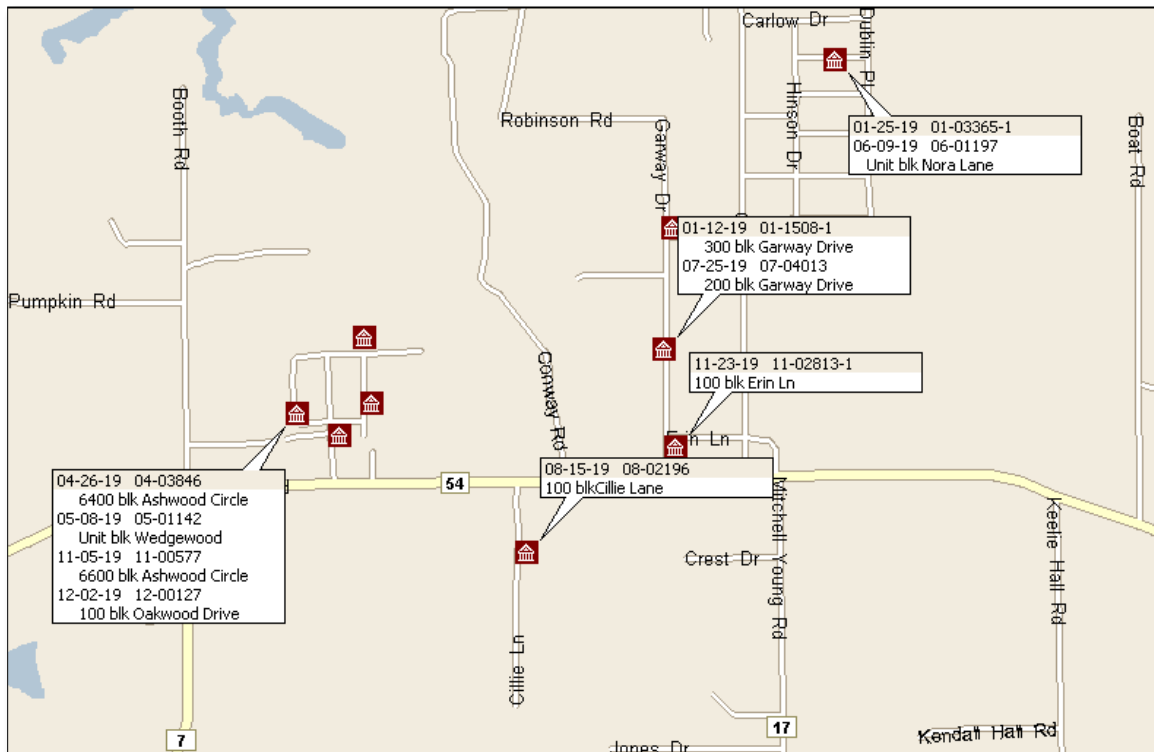

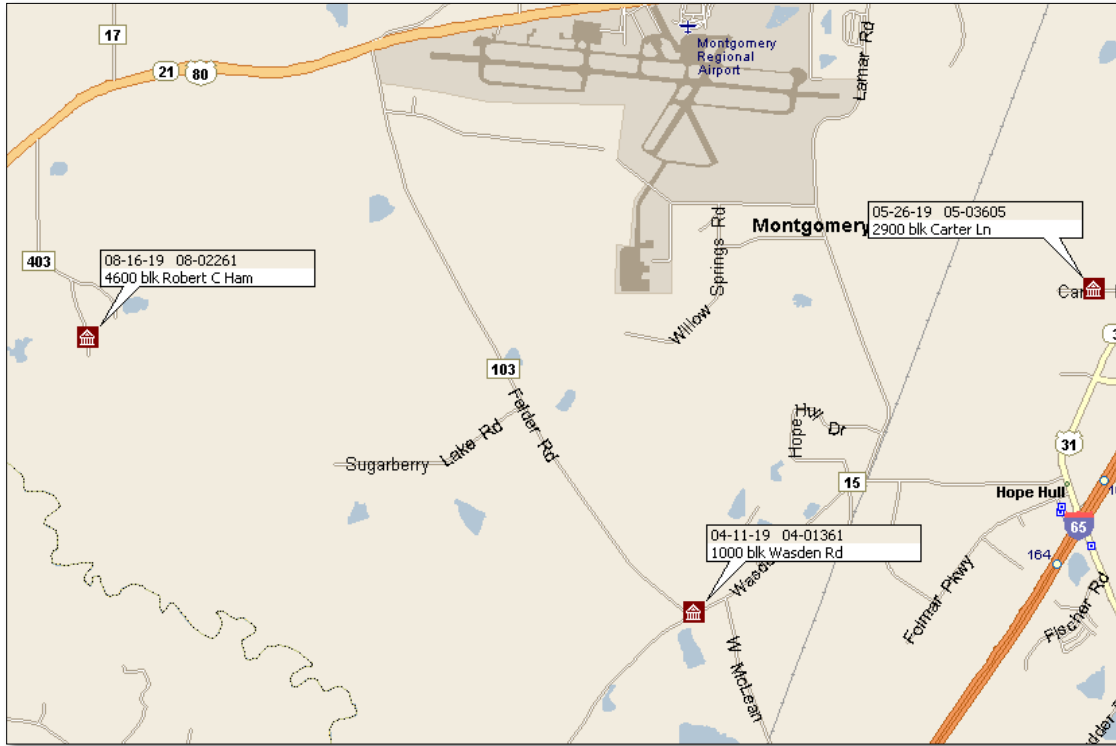

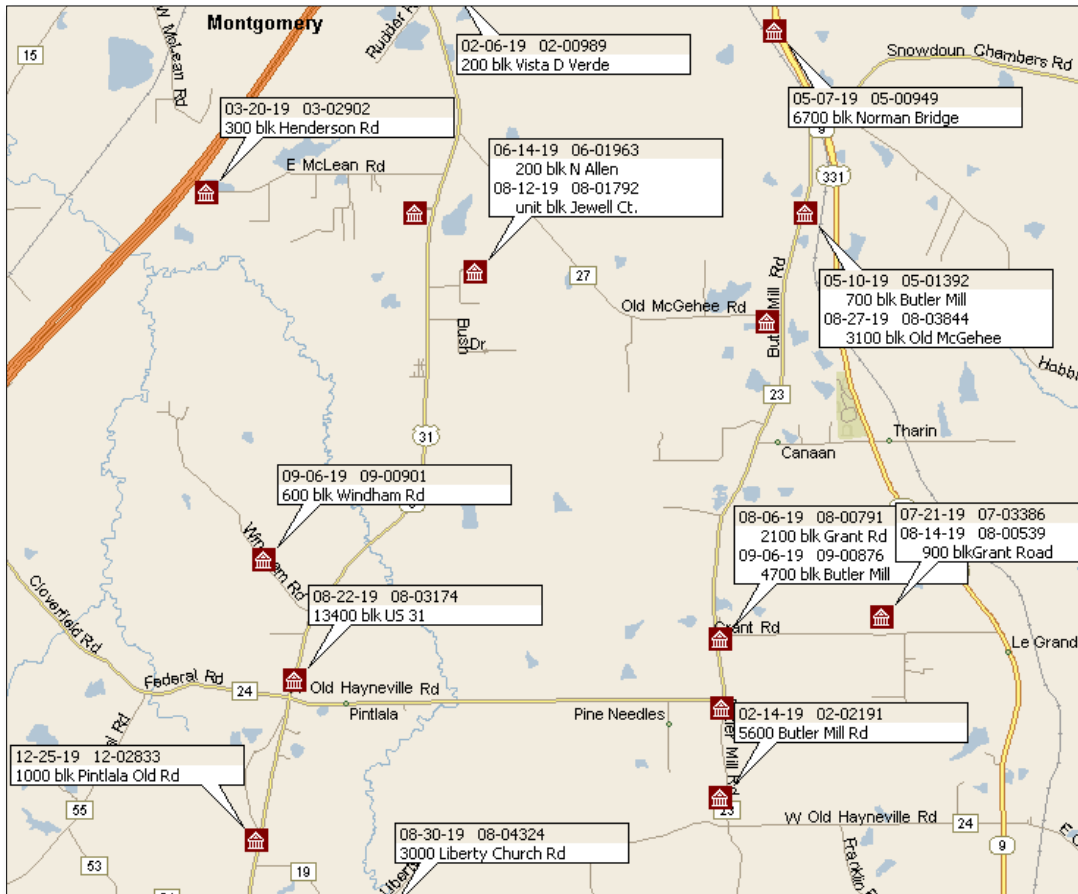

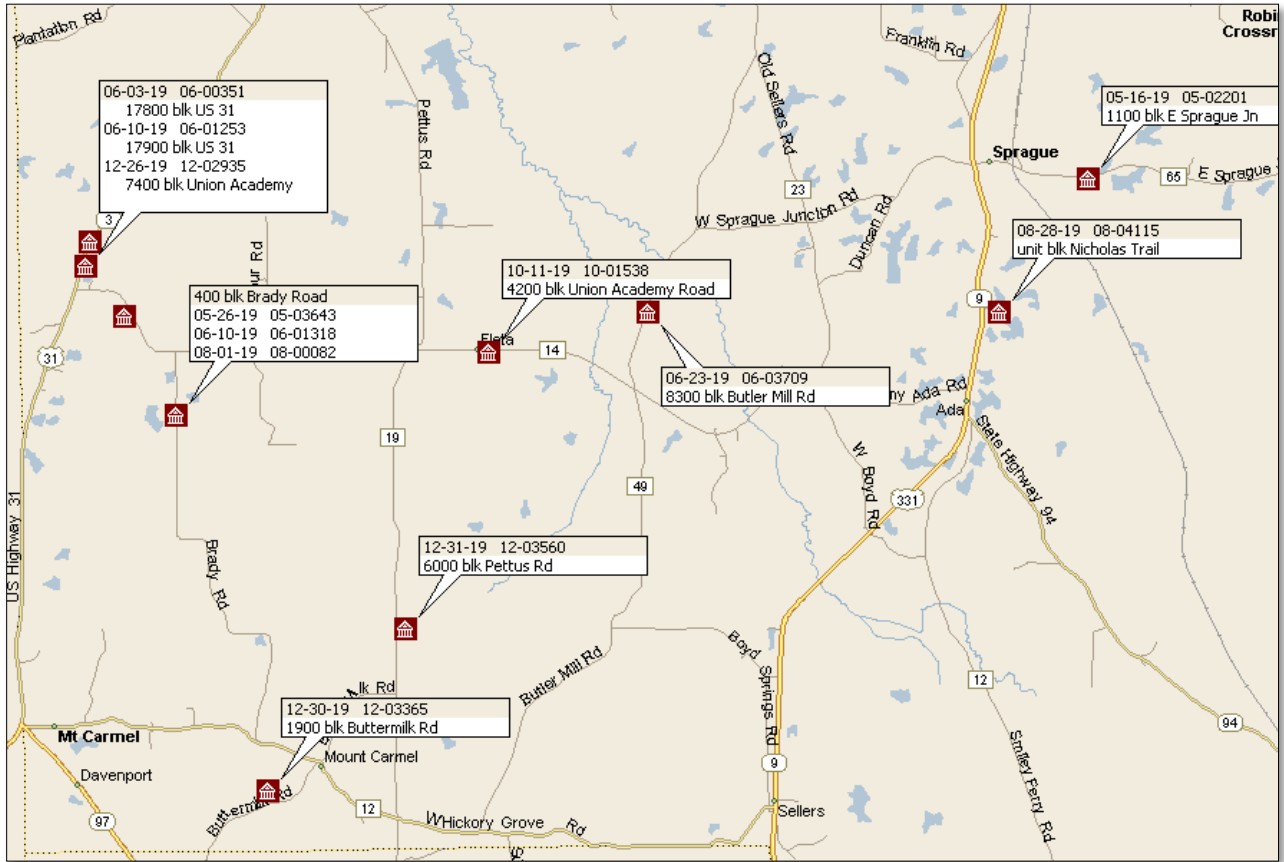

The robbery of a Hope Hull Business in September has been cleared by Cpl. M. Garner. Cpl. Garner worked with multiple area law enforcement agencies to identify suspects in robberies that occurred in multiple jurisdictions. DNA evidence from the Hope Hull robbery was linked to one of the suspects.

Cpl. Garner obtained warrants for the arrest of the suspect. Garner, Lowndes County law enforcement and U. S. Marshals located the suspect in Lowndes County where he was taken into custody. The Hope Hull robbery was cleared by arrest. Further charges are expected in the case.

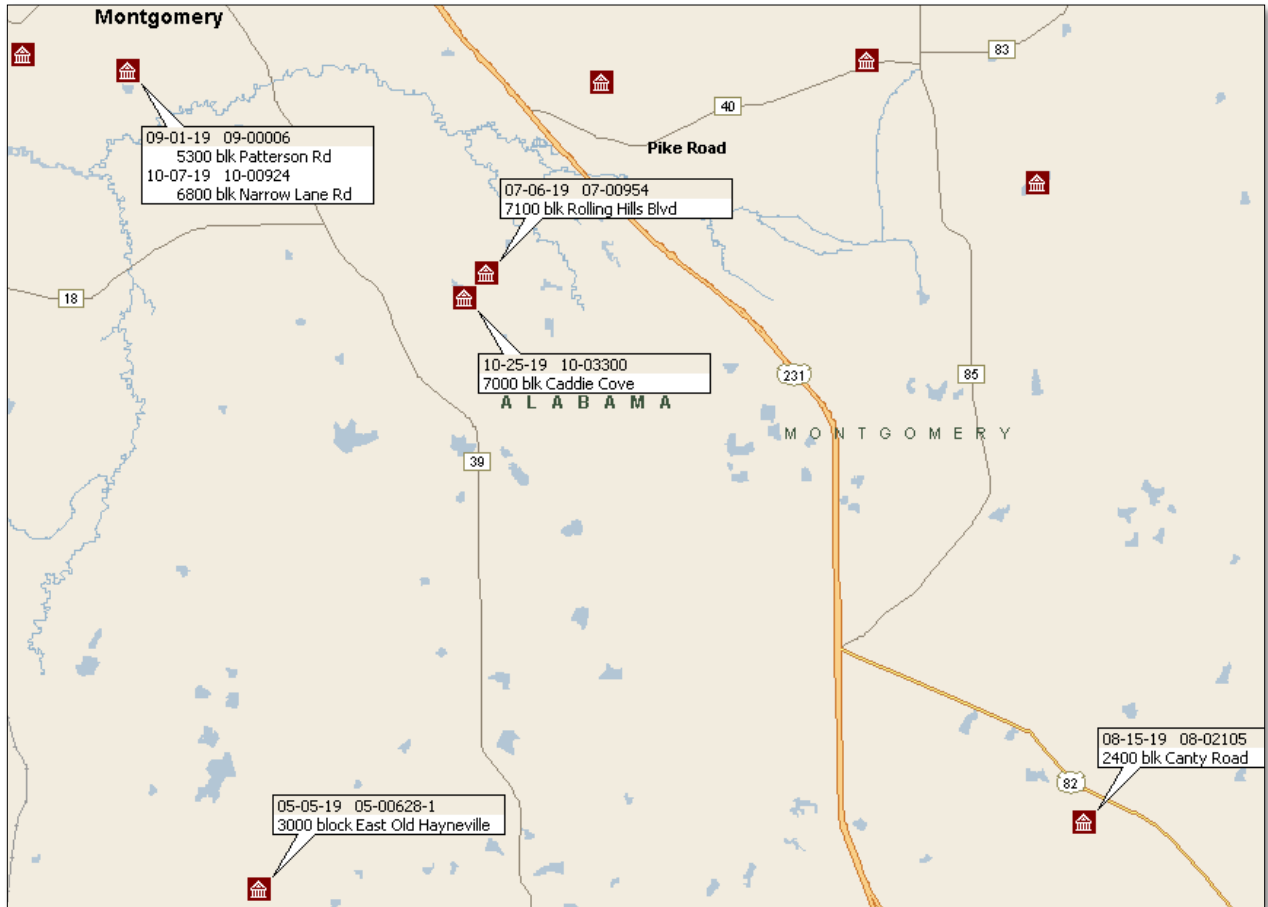

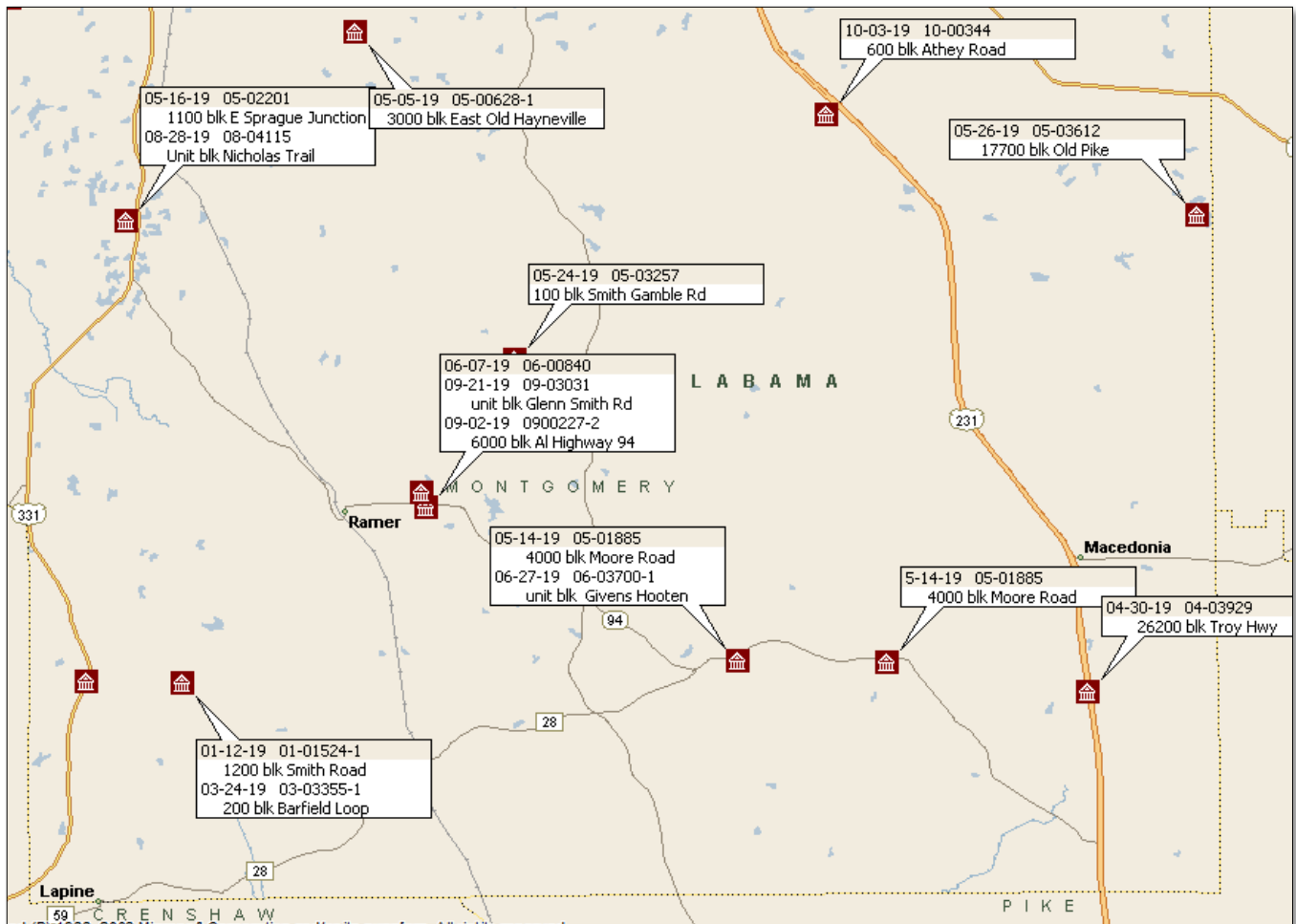

2019 Fourth Quarter Deputy of the Quarter



Corporal J. Shepherd, our **2019 Fourth Quarter Deputy of the Quarter** was nominated by Criminal Investigations Division (CID) Commander Captain T. Beasley for his outstanding efforts on several recent case assignments. Captain Beasley commented:

“Cpl. Shepherd is a highly valued asset of the CID Division. During this quarter he has been the lead investigator on a capital murder case which was an extremely complex investigation.” The investigation started with little more than a ‘street name’ for one of several suspects. Shepherd, through hard work and perseverance, arrested three defendants responsible for the death of one individual and the injury of two others. One of victims was a one-year old child.

During this quarter Cpl. Shepherd was also the lead investigator in a burglary of a Pike Road mini-storage facility which resulted in the arrest of four defendants. Eight felony warrants were signed and the recovery of additional stolen property that was taken from cases in the city of Montgomery.

2019 MCSO Deputy of the Year



Sergeant David Alford received information from the Montgomery Police Department that provided a description of a suspect vehicle occupied by suspects wanted for a murder and robbery in St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana. The vehicle was observed northbound on Interstate 65, possibly traveling into Montgomery County. Sgt. Alford alerted dispatch, responded to the area and assigned deputies to the Hope Hull location of I-65 in an attempt locate the suspect vehicle. Shortly thereafter, the suspect vehicle was located on I-65 near the Selma Highway exit.

Assisted by officers of the Montgomery Police Department, Sgt. Alford activated his emergency equipment. The suspect vehicle refused to stop. A pursuit continued toward east Montgomery County on Vaughn Road. Montgomery County deputies “spiked” the suspect vehicle on Vaughn Road near Wildwood Dr. The driver lost control and left the roadway. A female occupant of the vehicle was detained immediately. Two male suspects fled on foot. Sgt. Alford and assisting deputies located them after a brief search.

Lt. R. Thompson, in recommending Sergeant David Alford as the [first quarter] Deputy of the Quarter writes: “After locating the vehicle, Sgt. Alford displayed a very calm, professional demeanor while conducting the pursuit. He was able to relay clear, concise radio traffic to dispatch, which allowed other deputies to identify his location and assist with the incident. Sgt. Alford displayed impeccable judgment and a professional demeanor while negotiating various traffic conditions, all the while maintaining sight of the suspect vehicle. Sgt. Alford maintained public safety first throughout a dangerous encounter. His actions resulted in the apprehension of three dangerous fugitives, who obviously had no regard for the welfare of others.”

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office is now accepting applications for our *Citizens Academy*. The Citizens Academy was established in 1997 to educate the citizens of Montgomery County on how the Sheriff's Office operates and to promote public safety among our community members. Montgomery County Sheriff's Office TO INCREASE ACCESS TO SAFE MEDICATION DISPOSAL WITH DRUG COLLECTION UNIT DONATED BY CVS HEALTH

Joint effort by CVS Health and Partnership for Drug-Free Kids aims to combat drug abuse, encourage safe drug disposal in local communities

On Friday, March 17, 2017, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office unveiled their new drug collection unit they received as part of CVS Health's Medication Disposal for Safer Communities Grant Program. The new unit will be located at Administrative Office of the Sheriff, at 100 South Lawrence (2nd floor lobby) and will provide residents with a safe and environmentally responsible way to dispose of unwanted, unused or expired medication, including controlled substances.

"CVS Health is dedicated to helping the communities we serve address and prevent prescription drug abuse," said Tom Davis, R.Ph. Vice President of Pharmacy Professional Services at CVS Health. "Reducing the amount of unused and unwanted medication in the home is critical to preventing prescription drug abuse. We are proud to work with the Partnership for Drug-Free Kids and local leaders to increase convenient access to safe medication disposal."

The new drug disposal unit will help to reduce the amount of unneeded medicine in residents' homes and decrease the potential for prescription drug abuse, which has soared in recent years, especially among teenagers. More than 70 percent of teenagers say it is easy to get prescription drugs from their parents' medicine cabinets, according to a Partnership for Drug-Free Kids study. Proper drug disposal also helps to prevent the contamination of local landfills and water supplies from unused medication.

Over the last few years, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has participated with the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) and their Drug Take Program. We have collected hundreds of pounds of unused or expired medication. "Sheriff Derrick Cunningham and the staff of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office are proud to partner with CVS and would like to thank them for providing this grant opportunity. This Drug Collection Unit will help us offer the citizens of Montgomery a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating them about the potential for abuse and misuse of medication". The Medication Disposal for Safer Communities program has donated more than 600 drug collection units to law enforcement agencies across the country, which have collected more than 47 metric tons or 100,000 pounds, of unwanted medication. CVS Health also assists law enforcement by supporting local drug take back events and promoting local drug disposal collection sites.

MCSO Firearms Familiarization Course



We have already begun our firearms course to “familiarize” Montgomery County citizens about the laws and proper use of a firearm. We know that learning how to protect yourself is very important in today’s world. Our course is held one Saturday a month. The 2020 classes have been scheduled for the following dates:

*March 14, April 18, June 6, July 11,
August 8, September 5, October 10.*

The class is held at our Sheriff D. T. Marshall Firearms Training Center located at 6900 Janet Warner Road and is **FREE** to Montgomery County citizens! The morning session is classroom instruction on firearm safety and firearm laws. The afternoon session allows citizens to practice shooting on our Firing Range for the remainder of the class (if you would like). All classes are under the instruction of the Montgomery County Sheriff’s Office Range Master.

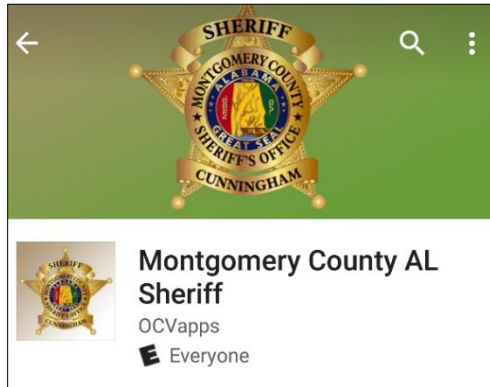

Sheriff's Office APP



The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has a new phone app called "Montgomery County AL Sheriff" that can be accessed through your phone's app store. Once you have added this app to your phone, you can easily set your phone up to receive important push notifications. Push notifications are quick, important messages that can notify you of road closure(s), blocked road(s), anything pertinent to your travel, escapee, etc. While our app can help you with many things including checking to see if someone is in the county jail, it is most helpful to receive push

notifications. After you have downloaded the app, go through the follow steps to make sure your phone is set up to receive the push notifications:

- Go to your phone's setting icon
 - Scroll down and click "Applications"
 - Scroll down to "MCSO" or "Montgomery County Sheriff"
- OR
- Click "Application Manager", if it doesn't take you directly to the location
 - Click "Notifications"
 - Turn 'on' "Allow Notifications" and "Previews in pop-ups"

You should be all set to receive the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office push notifications!
