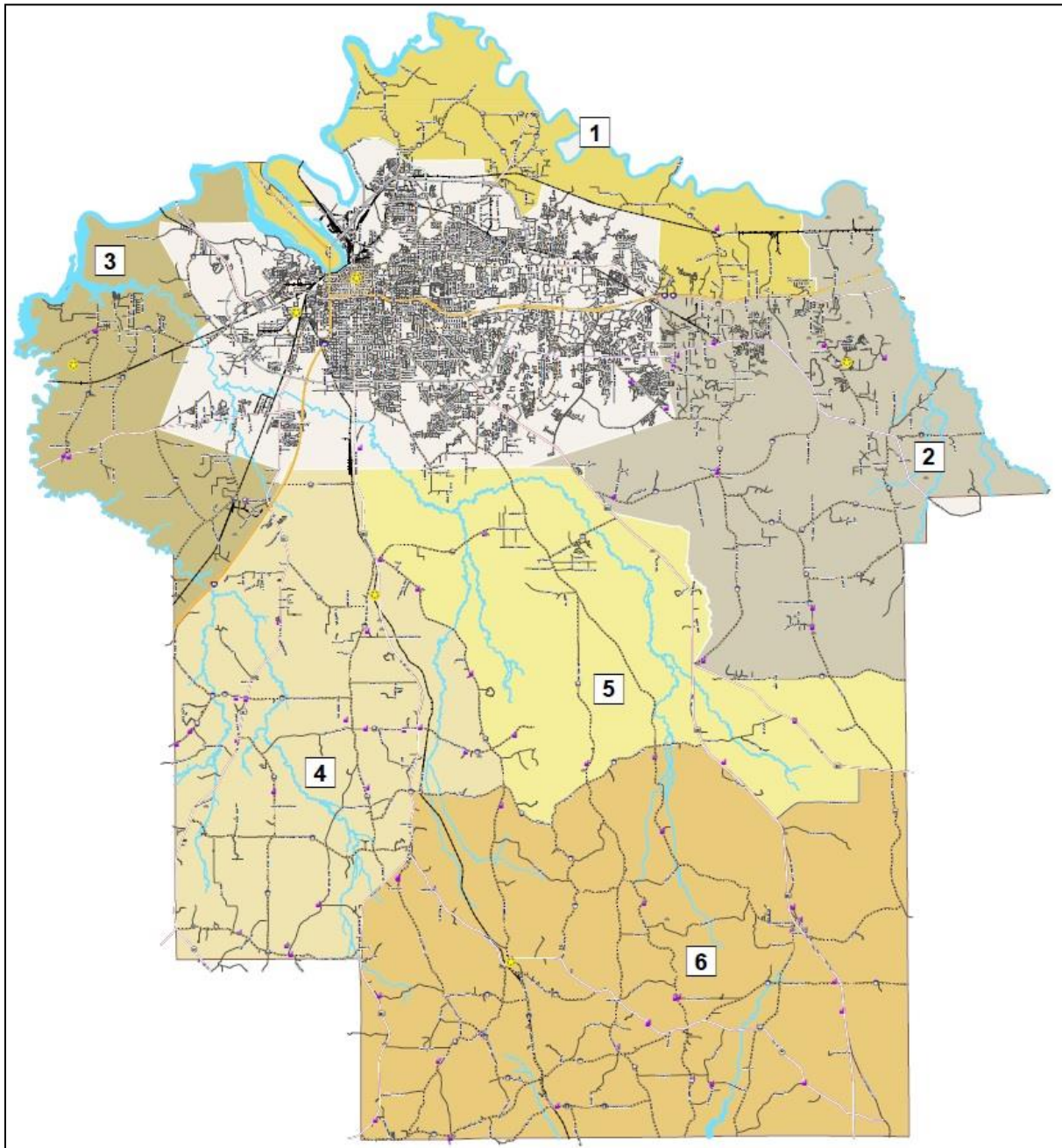

Sheriff Named One of Alabama's Top 10 Local Officials

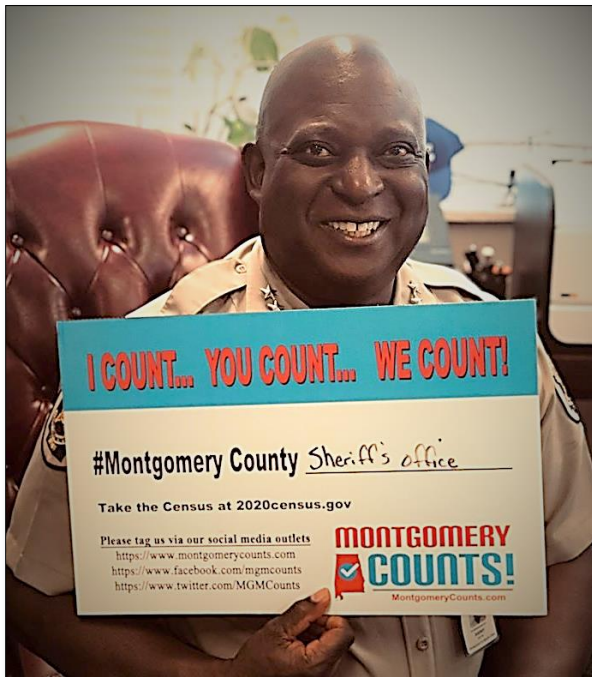
Earlier this year Yellowhammer News named Sheriff Derrick Cunningham as one of the top local officials in the State of Alabama:

Red squares indicate locations of residential burglaries

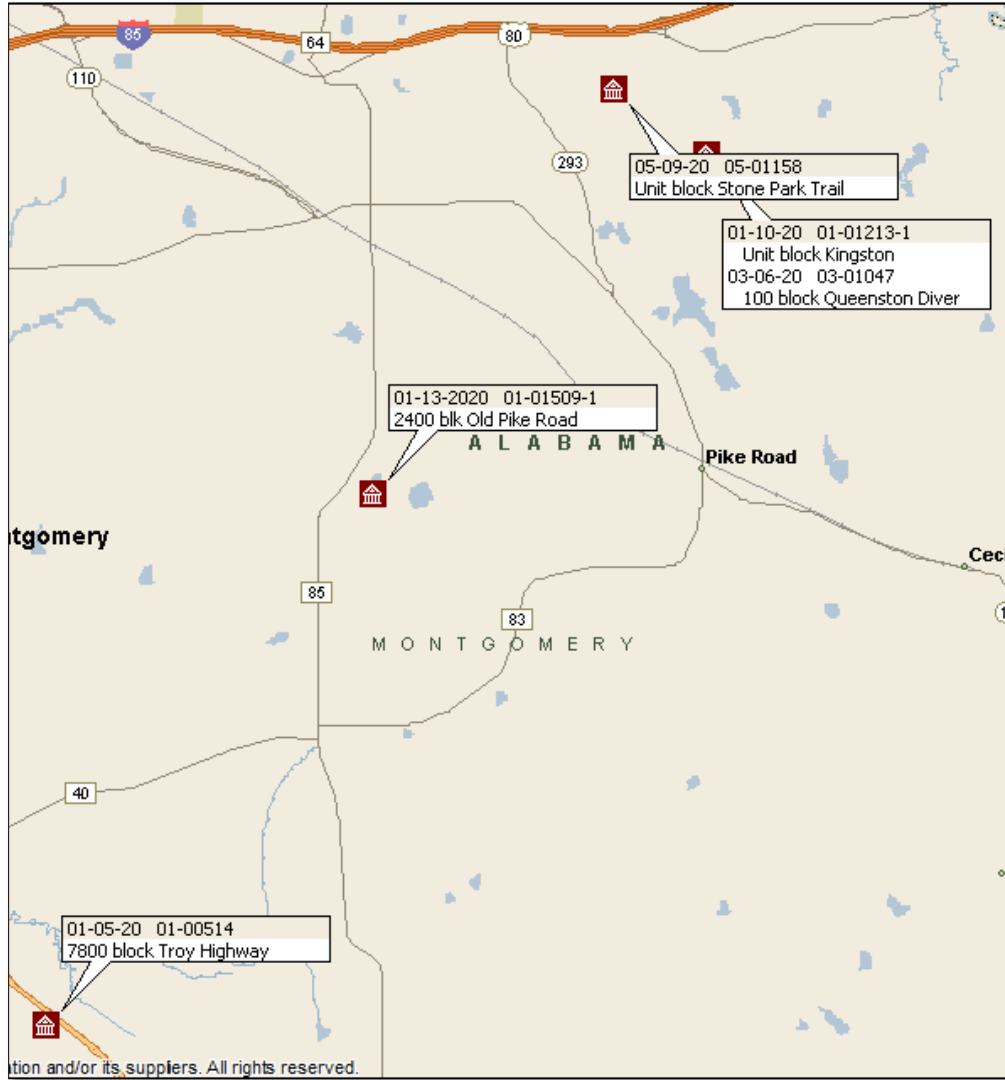

District 2 Arrests

Devontae Walker



In early January an employee at Pike Road Elementary School encountered two suspects who were burglarizing the school. MCSO dispatch was contacted and given a description of the fleeing suspect vehicle. Deputy W. Sasser located the vehicle on Marler Road and apprehended the offenders. Investigators developed evidence to charge them.

In January the owner of a vacant residence in District 2 arrived at her property and observed an unfamiliar vehicle in the driveway. She encountered two females, who claimed to have car trouble. It was discovered they were burglarizing the residence. The suspects violently assaulted the victim, stole her vehicle, and fled the area. MCSO dispatch alerted responding deputies and provided a description of the car. Deputy Demetrius Dupree pursued the vehicle through multiple counties. With the assistance of MCSO deputies and other law enforcement agencies, the suspects were apprehended in Macon County.

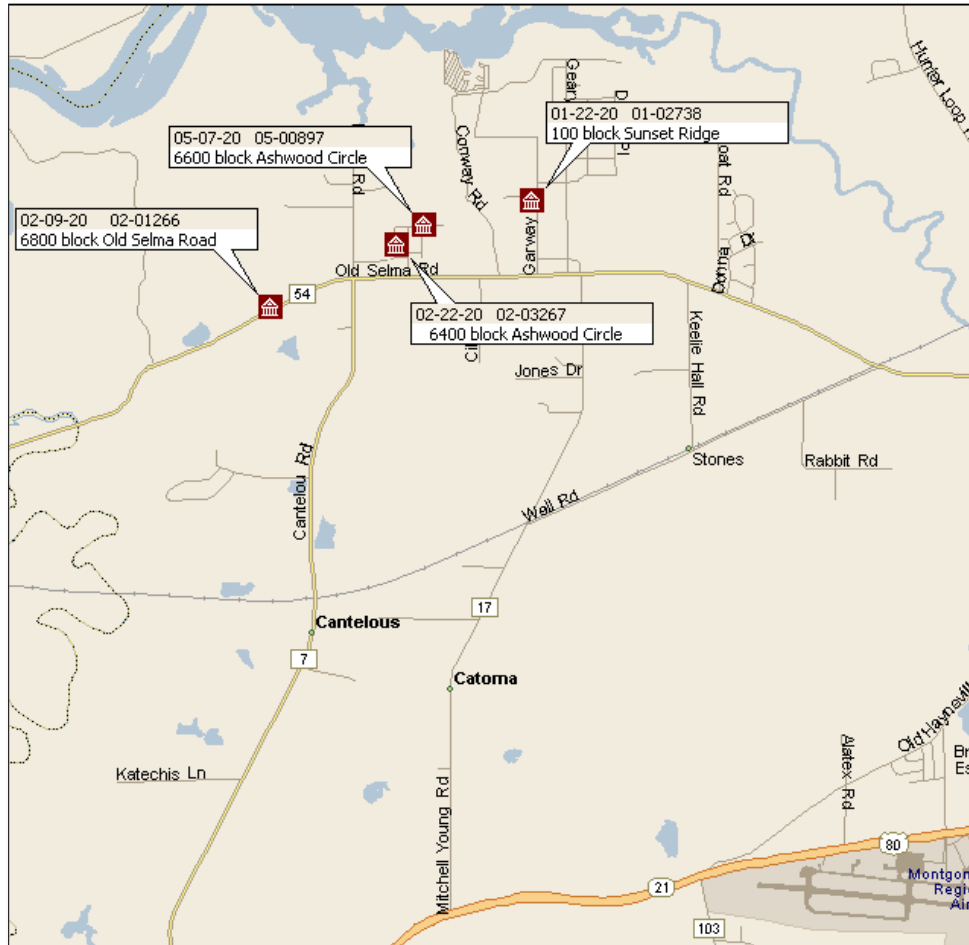

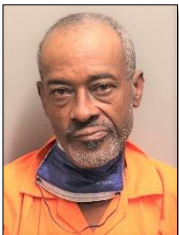

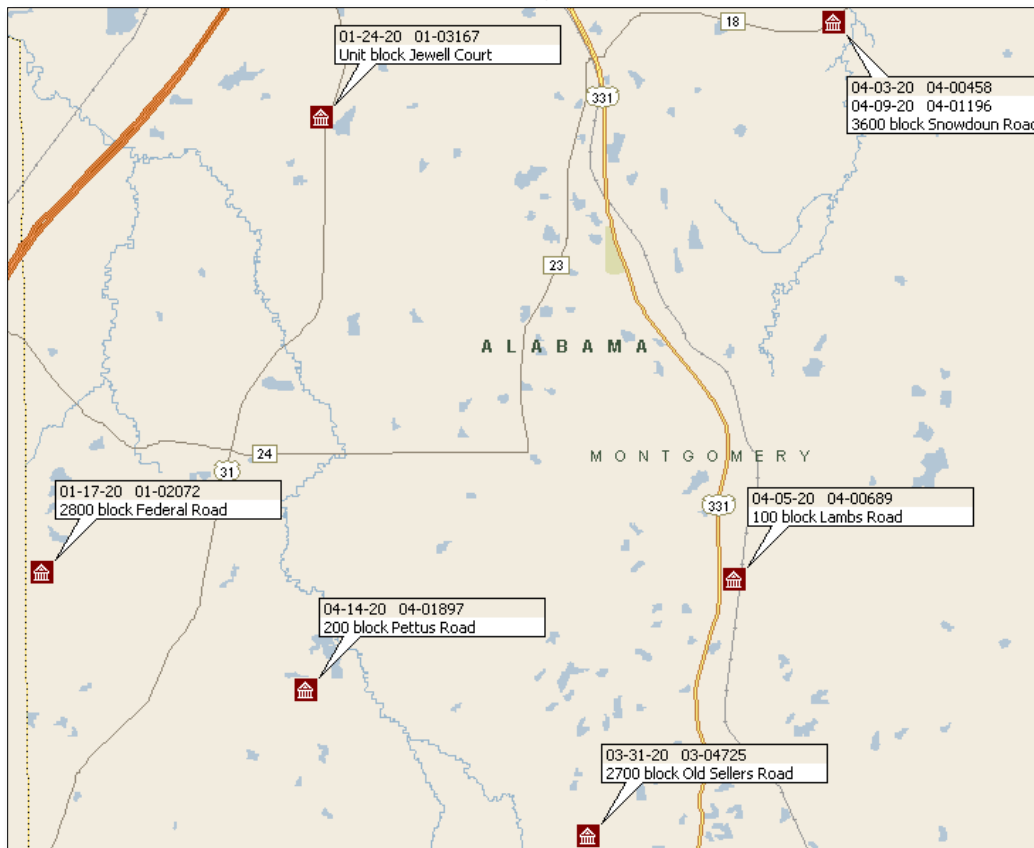

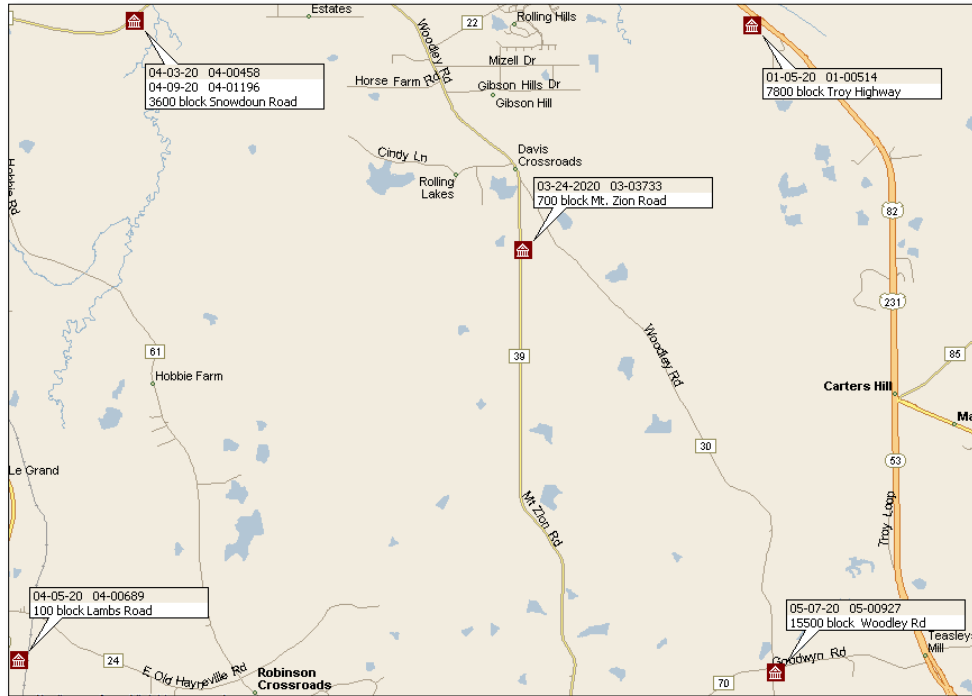

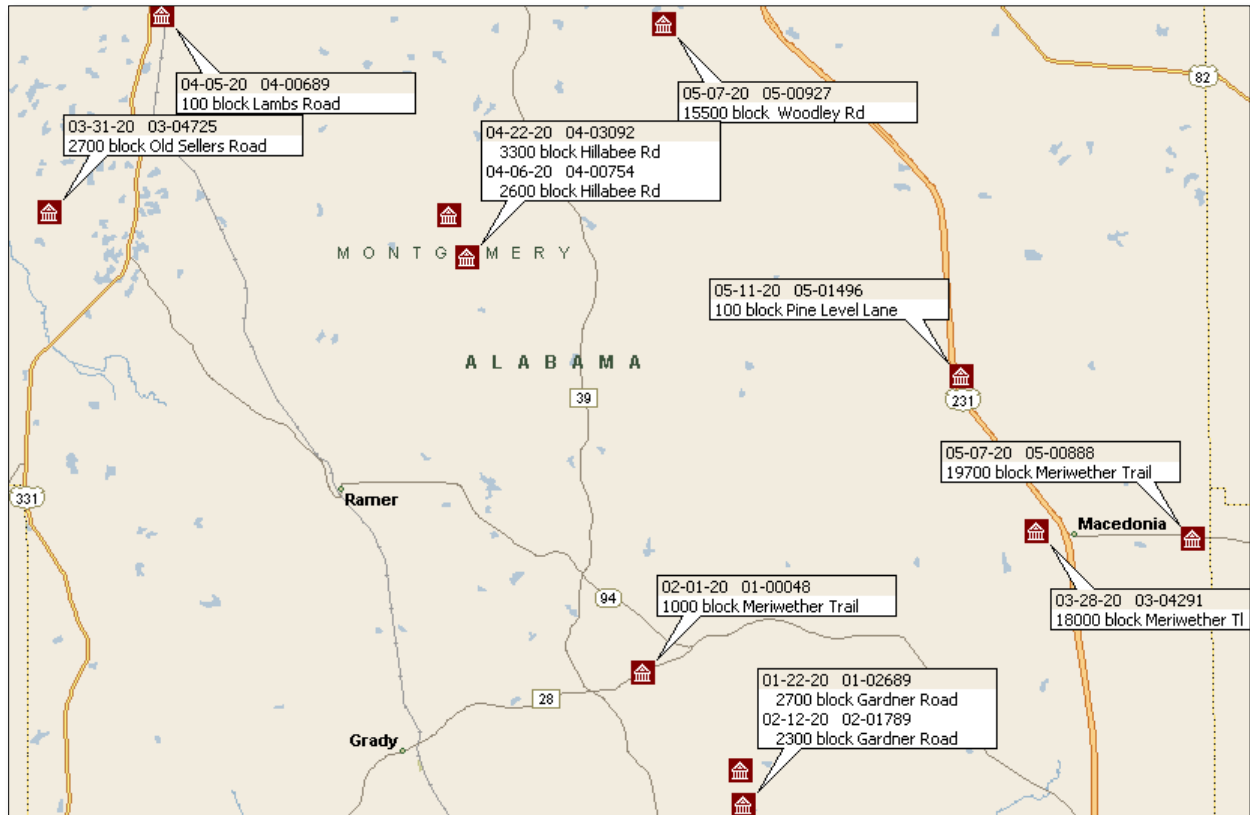

2020 - First Quarter – MCSO Deputy of the Quarter



Deputy Demetrius Dupree is recognized for his actions in apprehending two robbery suspects. In January 2020, two female suspects, during the commission of a burglary on Old Pike Road, assaulted a homeowner and stole her vehicle. Soon afterwards, Deputy Dupree located the vehicle traveling on Marler Road. The suspects led Deputy Dupree and several Montgomery County deputies on a lengthy pursuit through adjoining counties. Due to his keen observation skills and intuitive law enforcement work, he was able to maintain the pursuit in heavy rain, under dangerous circumstances. Deputy Dupree was assisted by MCSO deputies, the Alabama State Troopers and the Macon County Sheriff's Office. The suspects were taken into custody in Macon County. Deputy Dupree's skillful performance of the pursuit allowed

for the safe apprehension of the offenders. A copy of Captain George Beaudry's commendation was placed in Deputy Dupree's personnel file.

2020 - First Quarter – MCSO Civilian Employee of the Quarter



Dispatcher Wendy Deese is recognized for her outstanding work performance during the first quarter of 2020. The pursuit and arrest by Deputy Dupree started with the Montgomery County Dispatch Center receiving a 911 call of a burglary in progress at a residence on Old Pike Road. The caller advised that an elderly female had been assaulted and injured during the burglary (robbery). Dispatcher Deese was efficient in gathering and relaying critical information to the deputies. The pursuit entered Bullock and Macon Counties. Utilizing the automated vehicle locator (AVL), Dispatcher Deese relayed locations to the deputies in the pursuit. This was a high-stress situation with dangerous individuals being pursued by our deputies. When the pursuit was in Bullock County, the radio service began diminishing. With

her knowledge of the radio system and how vital radio communication is, she advised the law enforcement officers to hold their traffic on the radio. In those crucial seconds, Dispatcher Deese merged the MCSO radio channels through the state system, giving our deputies the ability to communicate efficiently again. Dispatcher Deese continued to monitor the AVL system, assisting in relaying road information to the deputies in pursuit. While coordinating the complex radio traffic, Dispatcher Deese simultaneously assisted and advised other dispatch centers from adjoining agencies of the situation. The suspects were taken into custody without incident.

Lt. J. B. Douglass' commendation stated: "Dispatcher Deese's actions during the initial call and pursuit gave our deputies the best opportunity to end it successfully. Dispatcher Deese is the voice on the other side of the radio any deputy would want to answer if their life was on the line. She goes above and beyond in her performance."

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office is now accepting applications for our *Citizens Academy*. Montgomery County Sheriff's Office TO INCREASE ACCESS TO SAFE MEDICATION DISPOSAL WITH DRUG COLLECTION UNIT DONATED BY CVS HEALTH

Joint effort by CVS Health and Partnership for Drug-Free Kids aims to combat drug abuse, encourage safe drug disposal in local communities

On Friday, March 17, 2017, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office unveiled their new drug collection unit they received as part of CVS Health's Medication Disposal for Safer Communities Grant Program. The new unit will be located at Administrative Office of the Sheriff, at 100 South Lawrence (2nd floor lobby) and will provide residents with a safe and environmentally responsible way to dispose of unwanted, unused or expired medication, including controlled substances.

"CVS Health is dedicated to helping the communities we serve address and prevent prescription drug abuse," said Tom Davis, R.Ph. Vice President of Pharmacy Professional Services at CVS Health. "Reducing the amount of unused and unwanted medication in the home is critical to preventing prescription drug abuse. We are proud to work with the Partnership for Drug-Free Kids and local leaders to increase convenient access to safe medication disposal."

The new drug disposal unit will help to reduce the amount of unneeded medicine in residents' homes and decrease the potential for prescription drug abuse, which has soared in recent years, especially among teenagers. More than 70 percent of teenagers say it is easy to get prescription drugs from their parents' medicine cabinets, according to a Partnership for Drug-Free Kids study. Proper drug disposal also helps to prevent the contamination of local landfills and water supplies from unused medication.

Over the last few years, the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has participated with the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) and their Drug Take Program. We have collected hundreds of pounds of unused or expired medication. "Sheriff Derrick Cunningham and the staff of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office are proud to partner with CVS and would like to thank them for providing this grant opportunity. This Drug Collection Unit will help us offer the citizens of Montgomery a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating them about the potential for abuse and misuse of medication". The Medication Disposal for Safer Communities program has donated more than 600 drug collection units to law enforcement agencies across the country, which have collected more than 47 metric tons or 100,000 pounds, of unwanted medication. CVS Health also assists law enforcement by supporting local drug take back events and promoting local drug disposal collection sites.

MCSO Firearms Familiarization Course



We have already begun our firearms course to “familiarize” Montgomery County citizens about the laws and proper use of a firearm. We know that learning how to protect yourself is very important in today’s world. Our course is held one Saturday a month. The 2020 classes have been scheduled for the following dates:

The class is held at our Sheriff D. T. Marshall Firearms Training Center located at 6900 Janet Warner Road and is **FREE** to Montgomery County citizens! The morning session is classroom instruction on firearm safety and firearm laws. The afternoon session allows citizens to practice shooting on our Firing Range for the remainder of the class (if you would like). All classes are under the instruction of the Montgomery County Sheriff’s Office Range Master.

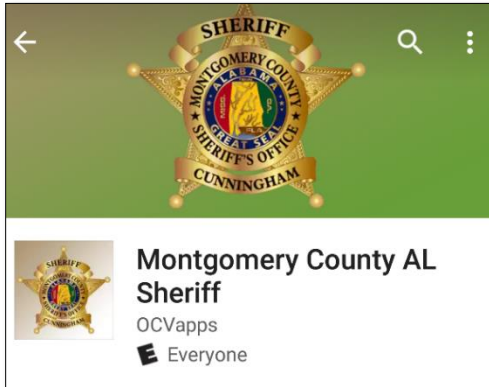

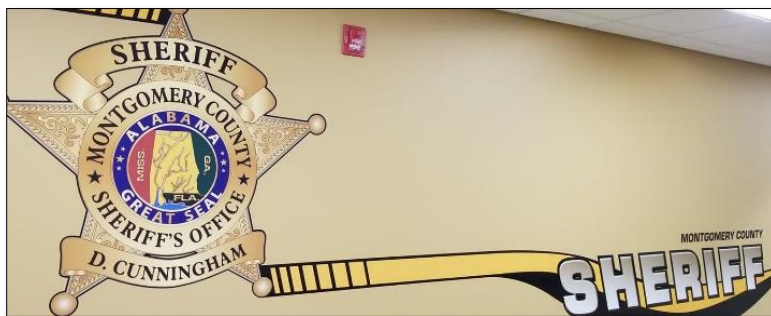
The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has a new phone app called "Montgomery County AL Sheriff" that can be accessed through your phone's app store. Once you have added this app to your phone, you can easily set your phone up to receive important push notifications. Push notifications are quick, important messages that can notify you of road closure(s), blocked road(s), anything pertinent to your travel, escapee, etc. While our app can help you with many things including checking to see if someone is in the county jail, it is most helpful to receive push

notifications. After you have downloaded the app, go through the follow steps to make sure your phone is set up to receive the push notifications:

- Go to your phone's setting icon
 - Scroll down and click "Applications"
 - Scroll down to "MCSO" or "Montgomery County Sheriff"
- OR
- Click "Application Manager", if it doesn't take you directly to the location
 - Click "Notifications"
 - Turn 'on' "Allow Notifications" and "Previews in pop-ups"
